Just a quick reminder from the Youth Services Department.

We work diligently to make the library a family-friendly space. One of the ways we do this is by keeping the lower level a space for children and their parents and/or caregivers to spend time and explore what we have to offer. This is why the Board of Trustees has incorporated boundaries into the Youth Services policy for who, and how, the space is used by the community.

#### **Youth Services Policy on Youth Areas**

"The youth area shall be distinct from the adult area. It is understood that youth areas are no longer places of silence, but interactive learning environments with flexibility towards noise. Adults are permitted in the Youth Services Department when accompanied by a child or if the adult is actively browsing the collections. Any adult not in compliance with this provision will be asked to use other areas of the library."


